
We hope to see you at our events (be they virtual, in-person, or both!) and thank you for all that you do to empower nonprofits driving change in our local community.





# 2021 STATS TO BE PROUD OF

- > 1,464 hours of volunteer time provided by ESC volunteers. This equates to \$219,600 in pro bono consulting services to area nonprofits to help build their organizational capacity!
- > 153 participants, across three cohorts, attended ESC's virtual Board Leadership Bootcamp.
- > 138 individual organizations impacted by ESC services or programs in 2021.
- > 79 volunteer advisors with 34 of those actively engaged on a project in 2021.
- ➤ 48 Executive Directors participate in ESC's Executive Director Roundtable, providing our local EDs a support group and network of peers.
- > 29 individual projects signed with community organizations in 2021.
- > 6 workshops offered to the community on the following subjects:
  - Formulating & Monitoring a Strategic Plan
  - Founder's Syndrome: A Conversation
  - Supervision 101
  - Design Thinking
  - Fundraising and Development
